Please see below the match day arrangements;

- > Gates will be open from 2.00pm
 - > Crowd capacity of 150 spectators.
 - > Entry Fee: ADULTS - £6.00, CONCESSIONS - £3.00 (On a first come basis until the limit is reached).
 - > Unfortunately our clubhouse bar is now closed until further notice, but tea, coffee and snacks will be on sale inside the stadium.
 - > Track and Trace details must be provided on entry. QR code posters will also be at the entrance if you have downloaded the Covid-19 App.
 - > Players, Coaches and Match Officials are the ONLY persons permitted to enter the changing room area.
 - > Spectators must adhere to Government Guidelines regarding social distancing, (maximum groups of six).
 - > Spectators must also adhere to social distance markings and all signage on display.

 - > Match Day Programmes & Club Pin Badges will be on sale at the turnstile.



Today's Visitors

Lymington Town come to Barlow's Park today hoping to maintain their good start to this season's league and cup campaigns. Last Saturday they progressed to the next round of the FA Vase with a 3-0 win over Alresford Town. Last season saw us draw 2-2 at Barlow's Park with Rowan Vine scoring both Tadley goals. Adam Costello and an injury time goal from Mike Gosney ensured Lymington left with a share of the points.

The club can trace its roots back to 1876 when it started with a tent, balls, poles and flags - the minimum requirement in those far off days - and played on the site of the present ground. Little is recorded of the early years though they were long time members of the Hampshire League.

In 1986, playing as Lymington FC, they became founder members of the Wessex League and two years later merged with Wellworthy Athletic - who were based in the town - and became AFC Lymington.

The club enjoyed considerable success in the 1990's before moving to Fawcetts Field in New Milton in 1998 and amalgamating with the local club to form Lymington & New Milton FC. However, this merger

was not to the liking of many of the local people so Lymington Town was formed with their base still at the Sports Ground. After something of a battle with the football administration, the club were allowed into the Hampshire League Division Three with David Peach, a member of Southampton's 1976 FA Cup winning side as the manager.

Progression through the leagues followed until acceptance into the Wessex League at the end of the 2003-04 season. They quickly reached the Premier Division and won the League Cup in 2007 and they have remained in the top Division to this day. In season 2018-19 they hosted Torquay United in an impressive FA Cup run which was shown live on the BBC. Unfortunately their run came to an end as Torquay ran out 7-0 winners.

Last season they were in 5th position in the Premier Division when the season prematurely ended with Sam House their top scorer with 18 league goals.

They play their home games at The Sports Ground, Southampton Road, Lymington SO41 9ZG, and are affectionately known as 'The Town' by their loyal band of supporters.



Pride in Defeat?

Tadley Calleva 0 Truro City 1
Emirates FA Cup - First Qualifying Round
Tuesday 22nd September 2020

Two impressive wins in previous rounds of the FA Cup saw rewarded with a home draw against Southern Premier League side Truro City. The Cornish side made the 220 mile trip on Tuesday night and were welcomed with a full house of 297 noisy fans at Barlow's Park.

Manager Adam Clark had a fully fit squad to pick from with Jordan Goater back from suspension and Jamie Johnston & George Farrelly returning from injury. With Saturday's hat-trick hero Josh Drew up front, Tadley went into the game high in confidence with nothing really to lose against much higher level opposition.

We started the match fairly well and had the first real opportunity on goal when a Josh Drew strike flew wide of keeper James Hamon's right hand post.

Truro's first shot came from striker Rio Garside, but it was more than comfortably saved by Jack Martin. However, the visitors were beginning to show their quality, dominating possession, but not creating many chances of note. It would be fair to say that Tadley's defenders were at the top of their game out of possession.

The home side's next real chance came from a set piece on the half hour. Tadley were awarded a free kick some 25 yards from goal after Callum Cleary was up-ended. Andrew Charsley stepped up, but his strike was easily taken in by Hamon. Tadley keeper Jack Martin was then tested, for probably the first time in the match a few minutes later, when he made an excellent save from

Ed Palmer. Just when it looked like the teams would be going in level at the break, Truro broke the deadlock. A bit of good fortune for Ryan Dickson in the box saw the ball fall into the path of Alex Battle and he blasted a shot high into the net leaving Jack Martin with no chance.

The second half was a bit more of an even affair in terms of possession and the large crowd could sense the confidence grow in the home side the longer the game went on. However, it's also fair to say that our best chance of an equaliser was likely going to come from a set-piece. We did manage a decent spell of pressure, with five successive corners, but these were easily dealt with by an impressive Truro defence. A good run comes to an end, but the lads can take credit and hold their heads high.

Manager Adam Clark said after the game "We defended excellently throughout the game and I believe gave an impressive account of ourselves.

I thought we were more of a threat in the 2nd half, but didn't test their goalkeeper as much as I would have liked. The run is now over so we now need to focus on the league and FA Vase".

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
