# Hampshire Cup success...

## **Tadley Calleva 3 Bournemouth 0 Hampshire Senior Cup - 2nd Round Tuesday 4th October 2022**

The second round of the Hampshire Senior Cup saw what proved to be a very comfortable win against good (and former) Wessex Premier League opponents. With one eye on Saturday's away trip to face the impressive Jersey Bulls, there were a number of changes in the Tadley line-up....most notably A Team goalkeeper Darren Gary making his first team debut and who acquitted himself very well.

The game began evenly. In contrast to several of our Combined Counties League opponents, Bournemouth looked to build patiently from the back and were a bit less physical than some recent opposition. Tadley were able to exercise some dominance, but thanks to visiting keeper Miles Bartram we did not take the lead until the 28th minute and then it was through an own goal. Most notably, Bartram had previously made two excellent saves from Connor Thorne and Jamie Johnston in the opening 25 minutes. Darren Gary was also called into action early on, making an excellent save from Bournemouth striker Joe Smith. We added our second goal 5 minutes before half-time after a Scott Kinge drive was a bit fortunate in deflecting off Connor Thorne into the Bournemouth net. (HT 2-0)

Bournemouth continued to play out from the back after the break but, despite some nice moves, rarely caused trouble in the final third. The Tadley duo of Kalum Cousins and Jamie Johnston were pretty lively. A Cousins powerful drive was well parried by keeper Bartram

who then quick to seize on the loose ball. Johnston was proving tricky for Bournemouth full back Ieuan Turner down the left wing and, following a combination with Cousins, served a dangerous cross which went untouched by the Tadley front line as it went just beyond the far post.

Following a period of sustained pressure, Jordan Goater delivered an excellent corner and Brad Neal's clever movement saw him head powerfully home at the near post on 64 minutes. This signalled the opportunity for Joint Managers Ben Dillon and Joe Lawler to make personnel and a few positional changes. Soon after coming on, Brett Denham went close with a flicked header which just eluded the far post. And on the rare occasion that Bournemouth did manage to penetrate, the dependable Tom Walsh was on hand to clear the ball off the line.

As the game progressed to the late stages, both sides had a few opportunities to add to the soreline, but nevertheless Tadley can be pleased that a strong team effort also provided a welcomed clean sheet. (FT 3-0)

# Redhill FC



## Today's Visitors

We welcome Redhill to Barlows Park today in which will be the first ever meeting between the two clubs. Redhill are currently sitting in 3rd position of the CCL (South) table after a great start to their league campaign. Both teams are in good form so we hopefully should see a hard fought and competitive match this afternoon.

Redhill FC was formed in 1894 and two years later the club moved into its stadium of 88 years....Memorial Park, which is in the centre of the town. Redhill became members of the Athenian League in 1923 and remained there until the league's demise in 1984. Success came early, being runners up and champions in their first two seasons in the league.

In 1925-26, the club enjoyed possibly its best season; reaching two cup finals and reaching the semi-final of the FA Amateur Cup, losing to Northern Nomads at Arsenal's Highbury Stadium in front of 17,000 people. In 1949, Redhill lost 1-0 in a friendly that was offered by the 'Gunners' after Redhill provided them with two of their best players at the time; Colin Grimshaw and Bernard Sexton.

In 1957-58, Redhill reached the FA Cup 1st Round proper for their only time after defeating Tooting & Mitcham in the previous round. The Reds then travelled to Norwich City, only to lose 6-1, but many write ups gave Redhill plenty of credit for their performance. After winning the final Athenian League

title in 1984, the Reds were moved into their current home at Kiln Brow. Lack of facilities meant the club could not take their rightful place in the higher league and instead found some success in the London Spartan League before moving on to the Sussex County League in 1988.

After many brutal years of ups and downs, following hard work by many club officials and supporters keeping the club alive, Redhill eventually found themselves as runners up of the Sussex League Division One in 2013, winning promotion to the Isthmian League Division One (South).

Redhill's time in the 'Ryman' league was relatively short lived. They finished 3rd from bottom in the relegation zone in their first season, but survived when offered a reprieve.

The following season saw them finish in the relegation zone once more and this time were relegated into the Combined Counties Premier Division. The club had a brief year at Step 6, winning promotion back to Step 5 at the first attempt.

The 'Lobsters' are heading in the right direction and in the 2020-2021 season ended a 22 year wait for silverware defeating Ascot United in the Cherry Reds Premier Challenge Cup.



# Stalemate in Jersey...

Jersey Bulls 0 Tadley Calleva 0  
Combined Counties League - Premier Division (South)  
Saturday 8th October 2022

Tadley earned a valuable away point last Saturday after making the long journey to the Channel Islands, backed by some 40+ travelling fans, to face an in-form Jersey Bulls side with 5 wins from 6 in the league to date. Tadley were able to frustrate our hosts for large periods and stayed resilient with some fantastic individual performances, particularly in the final minutes as the 'Bulls' tried everything in an attempt to find a late winner.

Chances were few and far between in the opening stages of the match with both teams creating a couple of half chances that never really looked to threaten the opposition goal. It was in the latter stages of the half after Jersey had won a corner on the left hand side before we came closest to a goal. The inswinging corner to the far post saw goalkeeper Craig Atkinson make a brilliant save, through a crowd of players and on the stretch, to tip the ball over the crossbar.

The game was starting to open up and Tadley had a great opportunity a few minutes later. Jersey goalkeeper Euan van der Vliet failed to clear the ball properly which was picked up by the energetic Jamie Johnston. Johnston played in Scott Kinge who sent a lovely reverse pass to Brett Denham, but unfortunately the flag went up as his cross ball was met by Connor Thorne. The hosts had a couple of chances just before half time. First, a great effort from 20 yards was equally met, and held, by the impressive Atkinson and a minute later a well drilled cross was cut out by Joe Cummuskey before it could reach Jersey striker Fraser Barlow looking for an easy tap-in. (HT 0-0)

The second half began in similar fashion to the first with both sides cancelling each other out in the middle of the park. Substitutions were then made by both dugouts in an attempt to change the tempo of the game and possibly spring a surprise on the opposition. This was to no avail as the second half was passing by uneventfully with Tadley looking to settle for the 0-0 draw.

However, Jersey had other ideas and tried everything into finding a late winner. They did come close in the 3rd minute of stoppage time when 'Bulls' winger Lorne Bickley made a marauding run into the 18-yard box. He was subsequently put under by the Tadley defence and was forced to lay the ball off to substitute Jake Prince who let fly with a shot that looked destined to be the likely winning goal. But it was that man again, Craig Atkinson, who made a spellbinding save. He got down quickly to his right hand side to push the ball round the post and out for a corner.

The final few minutes of added time fizzled out with no other real scoring opportunities for the first ever 0-0 draw at Jersey's Springfield Stadium. (FT 0-0)

# The History



Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
