Please see below the match day arrangements;

- > Gates will be open from 6.45pm
- > Crowd capacity of 300 spectators.
- > Entry Fee: ADULTS - £6.00, CONCESSIONS - £3.00 (On a first come basis until the limit is reached).
- > Unfortunately our clubhouse bar is now closed until further notice, but tea, coffee and snacks will be on sale inside the stadium.
- > Track and Trace details must be provided on entry. QR code posters will also be at the entrance if you have downloaded the Covid-19 App.
- > Players, Coaches and Match Officials are the ONLY persons permitted to enter the changing room area.
- > Spectators must adhere to Government Guidelines regarding social distancing, (maximum groups of six).
- > Spectators must also adhere to social distance markings and all signage on display.
- > Spectators must comply with our temporary 'one way' system for entry & exit from the stadium.
- > There is adequate car parking. Please respect the bays marked for disabled spectators and also the entrance ramp to the emergency access gates.

Tonight's Visitors

There has been organised football in Fareham since the 1880's, but Fareham Town Football Club in its present form was formed in 1946 from an amalgamation of three local clubs.

The new club played initially at Beaconsfield Meadow before moving to Bath Lane and progressed from the Portsmouth Senior League to the Hampshire League, reaching the First Division of the latter in 1953.

During their time in the Hampshire League the club won every honour within the County - the league on eight occasions, including five consecutive seasons from 1962/3 to 1967/8. The Hampshire Senior Cup was claimed three times and every other County Cup once. A successful Sunday side, the Fareham Centipedes, won the Sunday Cup in 1974.

There are newspaper records going back to the very early days when the club applied to the local authority to move to a purpose built stadium at Cams Alders in 1946, but it wasn't until 1975 that the club moved to the Cams and joined the Southern League in 1979 gaining promotion to the Premier Division in 1982. In 1989, the club was relegated on 51 points.

In 1988, the club for financial reasons, made the controversial decision to play at a lower level and joined the Wessex League Premier Division where they have remained to this day.

The club has reached the FA Cup 1st Round proper on four occasions, the last being in 1988 when, after holding Torquay Utd to a 2-2 draw at Plainmoor, they were defeated 3-2 at home in the replay.

The club has reached the semi-final of the FA Trophy in 1986/7 before losing 2-0 to eventual winners Kidderminster Harriers. During the run to the semi-final Conference Clubs Scarborough and Barnet were both beaten on their own grounds.

The club's last major honour was the shock defeat of hot favourites Farnborough Town to win the Hampshire Senior Cup in 1993.

Last season they were in 8th position in the Premier Division when the season prematurely ended. Josh Benfield their top scorer with 13 league goals. They are also affectionately known as 'The Creeksiders' by their loyal & vocal band of supporters.

Island in the Sun!

Cowes Sports 0 Tadley Calleva 4
Sydenhams Wessex League - Premier Division
Saturday 3rd October 2020

We made the long journey to the Isle Of Wight on Saturday surprised that the match had survived the relentless wet weather. However, our worries prior to leaving were unfounded as the sun was shining when we arrived, and the pitch was in perfect condition.

Manager Adam Clark had almost a full strength squad to pick from, but George Farrelly, Shay Barham and Charlie Cunningham were all still missing due to injury. Recent new signing Immanuel 'Manni' Soetan was added to the 14 man squad and was given his place in the starting line-up.

The opening 15 minutes were pretty even with both sides creating half chances, but nothing worthy of note. The game changed a few minutes later when Cowes were reduced to 10 men. An excellent through ball from Jake Nicholls released Josh Drew in on goal. However, a desperate lunge from Aaron Burford saw him receive a deserved red card in an attempt to prevent a certain goal.

It was pretty much one way traffic from then on and the opening goal arrived a few minutes later. This time it was Aiden Harris who spotted Josh Drew's run and he made no mistake as he rounded keeper Ed Hatt to score.

It was 2-0 just 10 minutes later. Shemar Pettet put excellent pressure on Cowes centre back Jared Wetherick and his attempted back pass was cut off by Josh Drew. He unselfishly squared the ball to Jamie Johnston to drive the ball home. Only some excellent goalkeeping and last ditch defending kept the score at 2-0 the break.

Tadley totally controlled the 2nd half as the home team looked weary at being a man down. The 3rd goal wasn't too far away. Jamie Johnston robbed full back Jimmy Wykes on the byeline before driving the ball under keeper Hatt from a tight angle.

New signing Manni Soetan was beginning to find space and was unlucky not to have earned a penalty after Callum Chase appeared to have blocked his drive with both hands. Josh Drew almost got his second goal of the match, but was denied by a great save from Hatt. Soetan eventually got his goal after 70 minutes after dispossessing Cowes skipper Chase and looping a left foot drive past the helpless Ed Hatt. It was a totally dominant display at this point and only the post and another excellent save from the Cowes keeper prevented the visitors adding to the score line.

Manager Adam Clark said after the game "I was delighted to get a convincing away win. We were far better than our last game against Lymington Town and created numerous chances. On another day the we could have scored a few more....

I was also pleased with our defensive display and the boys worked hard and deserved the clean sheet".

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
