Copy of Match Day Arrangements v Wallingford Town

Please see below the match day arrangements;

- > Gates will be open from 2.00pm
- > Crowd capacity of 300 spectators.
- > Entry Fee: ADULTS £6.00, CONCESSIONS £3.00 (On a first come basis until the limit is reached).
- > Track and Trace details must be provided on entry to the clubhouse and stadium.
- > Players, Coaches and Match Officials are the ONLY persons permitted to enter the changing room area.
- > Spectators must adhere to Government Guidelines regarding social distancing, (maximum groups of six).
- > Spectators must also adhere to social distance markings and all signage on display.
- > Spectators must comply with our temporary 'one way' system for entry & exit from the clubhouse and stadium.
- > There is adequate car parking. Please respect the bays marked for disabled spectators and also the entrance ramp to the emergency access gates.
- > Male, Female and Disabled toilet facilities are accessed at the front of the main building.

We ask that you please wash your hands and also use the hand sanitisor provided.

- > Tea, coffee and confectionary products will be on sale, but there is no hot food available at this time.
- > There is no standing at the clubhouse bar after you have been served. A card payment system is available.
- > You must leave the clubhouse bar if requested to do so. This will be only be necessary when the maximum limit has been reached.
- > Alcohol must not be taken out of the designated fenced off area.
- > Match Day Programmes & Club Pin Badges will be on sale at the turnstile or at the bar.

Today's Visitors

The club was founded in 1995 as the result of a merger of two local teams: the original Wallingford Town, a Hellenic League side at the time, and neighbours Wallingford United. The newly merged club was named AFC Wallingford.

In season 1997-98, the club became champions of the Chiltonian League and gained promotion into the Combined Counties League.

In season 2001-02, AFC Wallingford won the Combined Counties League comfortably and were then runners-up to Withdean 2000 and AFC Wimbledon in the succeeding two years.

However, the facilities at their ground, Hithercroft, did not meet the standards of the Isthmanian League and they were therefore denied promotion. A Football Association grant of £100,000 was used to fund ground improvements which would make a further promotion possible if they were to win the Combined Counties League.

However, after disruption caused by a large player turnover in the 2004-05 season (with several leaving for Didcot Town, who then went on to win the FA Vase) saw AFC Wallingford unable to avoid bottom

postion in the league and ultimately relegation. The 2005-06 season saw an upturn in fortunes for the club. with a runners-up finish in the Combined Counties League Division One resulting in a promotion and with it a switch to the Hellenic League Premier Division - a league deemed to be better suited to AFC Wallingford's geographical location in Oxfordshire.

In 2011, Wallingford set up its first junior teams and in 2013, the club's name was formally changed to the current Wallingford Town.

The club play their home games at Hithercroft, Wallingford Sports Park, Wallingford, OX10 9RB and they are affectionately known as 'Wally' by their loyal band of supporters.

Last season they were in 10th spot in the Hellenic League Division One (East) when the season was prematurely ended.

Euan Aitchinson and Stuart Walker were joint top scorers with 8 league goals each.

Message from the Manager

Unfortunately, we lost the game by 3-0 after not playing as well as I had hoped and we disappointly exited the League Cup early.

One of the other cups that we are still very much still involved with is the FA Cup. Last Sunday we travelled to Fawley AFC and came away with a 1-0 win in what was a bit of a scrappy affair. Scoring opportunities were limited for both sides

throughout but, fortunately for us, we scored late on thanks to an Andrew Charsley header. We have now received our reward with a home tie against the 'high flying' Truro City in a First Round Qualifier on Tuesday night. This is the furthest the club have progressed in this competition and we are one of only four Wessex League club's still remaining.

On to today's game and I am expecting a tough game against a Wallingford side that I'm sure will be determined to progress further in the Vase. I will be recalling a number of players and welcoming one back from injury so I will have a number of options available. While there has been a lot of interest in next Tuesday's game I, for one, will be focussed on a win this afternoon.



History is Made...

Fawley AFC 0 Tadley Calleva 1
Emirates FA Cup - Preliminary Qualifying Round
Sunday 13th September 2020

We travelled down to Southampton on Sunday to face fellow Wessex League side Fawley AFC hoping to make history by reaching the first qualifying round of the FA Cup. A late headed goal from Andrew Charsey in front of a crowd of 231 saw us do just that!

Manager Adam Clark had several selection problems to deal with and had to go into the match without Jordan Goater, Shay Barham, Josh Drew, Lors Nicholas and Jacob Rolfe respectively. George Farelly was forced to pull out after picking up an injury in the warm up. Luke McLean, Brad Quatromini and Harvey Beales were called up from the Reserve side to make their first team debuts.

On to the match; The teams, officials and supporters of both clubs observed a minute silence in memory of Tadley player Clive Makoni who had tragically passed away the previous week. A truly emotional moment.

The first half was a pretty scrappy affair with both teams keen not to concede. Tadley had probably the best goal scoring opportunities with Josh Elms and Jamie Johnston testing the home keeper. Tom Walsh also went close, but his long range effort was turned round the post by Fawley keeper Jamie Bruce. We thought we had taken the lead from the resulting corner, but Brad Neal's Header scraped the top of the crossbar. Fawley seemed happy to play on the counter. Jack Martin was called into his first serious bit of action late in the half and made an excellent save when he was left one-on-one with Lewis Connor.

The second half was a bit more open with both teams having several opportunities to open the scoring. Both keepers were far busier with Bruce saving a goal bound shot from Adam Bartlett and Jack Martin pulling off a terrific one handed save from Billy Lawrence. Tadley were pressing high up the pitch, but Fawley were very dangerous on the counter attack.

The deadlock was eventually broken ten minutes from time when Andrew Charsley headed home a flick on from Josh Elms to the delight of the away fans. The disappointment of conceding late had an immediate effect on the home side as they threw everyone forward in search of an equaliser. Only some excellent goalkeeping from Jack Martin (MOTM) and some last ditch defending prevented us from going to penalty shoot-out.

Manager Adam Clark said after the game "It what was a very challenging week for the club, I'm delighted to get into the next round. I'd like to dedicate today's win to the supporters of the club and to the family and friends of Clive Makoni".

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed it's name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.


Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had it's best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (loW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved it's ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make signifiacnt progress with the infrastructure off the field.
