Please see below the match day arrangements;

- > Gates will be open from 6.45pm
- > Crowd capacity of 300 spectators.
- > Entry Fee: ADULTS - £6.00, CONCESSIONS - £3.00 (On a first come basis until the limit is reached).
- > Track and Trace details must be provided on entry to the clubhouse and stadium.
- > Players, Coaches and Match Officials are the ONLY persons permitted to enter the changing room area.
- > Spectators must adhere to Government Guidelines regarding social distancing, (maximum groups of six).
- > Spectators must also adhere to social distance markings and all signage on display.
- > Spectators must comply with our temporary 'one way' system for entry & exit from the clubhouse and stadium.
- > There is adequate car parking. Please respect the bays marked for disabled spectators and also the entrance ramp to the emergency access gates.
- > Male, Female and Disabled toilet facilities are accessed at the front of the main building.
- We ask that you please wash your hands and also use the hand sanitiser provided.
- > Tea, coffee and confectionery products will be on sale, but there is no hot food available at this time.
- > There is no standing at the clubhouse bar after you have been served. A card payment system is available.

# Truro City



## Tonight's Visitors and the FA Cup.....*by John Gorman*

Truro first entered the FA Cup as far back as 1949-50 when they were members of the South Western League and lost out by 6-2 at home to Ilfracombe. A year later they defeated a team called Green Waves away from home. At this stage little can be found about this particular opponent other than they were based in Plymouth and 'represented' the town's fishing fraternity. Their previous entry into the competition was in 1906 and, after their defeat at the hands of Truro, never entered the competition again.

Given their geographical location Truro were always going to enjoy the benefits of regionalisation as regards the FA Cup draw, and between 1959 and 1963 they met Bideford in no fewer than five occasions with one draw and four defeats. This was followed by three years in which they met Falmouth. For some unknown reason Truro did not enter the competition between 1974 and 1992. In their first year back, and after defeating Ilfracombe and Torrington, they travelled to Weymouth and lost out by 3-2....the first game that they had been drawn away from what is generally known as the West Country.

In 2006-07, the club commenced its meteoric climb up the football pyramid leaving the South Western League to spend two seasons in the Western League,

one season in the Southern League South & West, two seasons in the Southern League Premier and finally, two seasons in the Conference South.

In 2011-12 they faced Wessex League opposition for the first time and only time (until tonight's game) and drew 1-1 with Bournemouth at Victoria Park before winning the replay by 3-2. Their best ever year in the FA Cup was in 2017-18 when they were defeated 3-1 by Charlton Athletic at The Valley in the 1st Round Proper.

As previously mentioned, due to their location, and the fact that they haven't generally progressed too far through the rounds in the FA Cup, they have never had to endure long journeys in this competition. However, tonight's journey involves a 440 mile round trip. We are delighted to welcome Truro to Barlow's Park, to enjoy their visit and have a safe journey home.

The club play their home games at Treyew Park, Truro, TR1 2TH and they are affectionately known as the 'White Tigers' by their loyal band of supporters.

Last season they were in 1st position in the Southern League Premier Division South when the season was unfortunately prematurely ended.

# Who drew our attention?

Tadley Calleva 4 Wallingford Town 1  
Buildbase FA Vase - First Qualifying Round  
Saturday 19th September 2020

We welcomed Hellenic League Division One side Wallingford Town to Barlow's Park last Saturday in the 1st Qualifying Round of the FA Vase. We were looking to bounce back quickly after our 2nd Round exit from the Wessex League Cup away at US Portsmouth the previous Tuesday evening.

Manager Adam Clark rested a few for the Portsmouth trip, but they were all re-called for this important Vase encounter. Josh Drew made his return, but George Farrelly and Jamie Johnston remained on the injury list.

We started the match on the front foot and soon had the Wallingford defence under pressure and deservedly took the lead on 15 minutes. A whipped cross, after a terrific run down the left by Aiden Harris, was tucked away by Josh Drew. A similar move some 10 minutes later with the same two players being involved saw Drew grab his second of the match to make it 2-0. The visitors were rocking at this point as they saw their involvement in this year's competition looking likely to be coming to an end. It was soon 3-0 and a Josh Drew hat-trick after he lobbed the keeper after great work from Brad Quatromini.

Just as the game was looking very comfortable Wallingford were given a bit of a lifeline. The referee penalised Andrew Charsley for what appeared to be an accidental hand ball right on the stroke of half-time and Stuart Walker made no mistake from the spot by sending Jack Martin the wrong way.

The second half was probably a more even encounter with both sides creating opportunities. Tadley keeper Jack Martin was a little busier than he had been in the first half. However, it was the home side that looked the more threatening and likely to add to the scoring.

Andrew Charsley thought he had made up for giving away the penalty when he saw his 25 yard shot crash off the underside of the crossbar. A few in the ground were convinced it had crossed the line and were doubly frustrated as the linesman flagged MOTM Josh Drew offside as he followed up to make sure. However, the fourth goal did come courtesy of a Shemar Prettet throw in. His long throw into the box glanced off a Wallingford head to find the far corner of the net to make it 4-1. A comfortable day for Tadley and into the next round at home to Frimley Green next month.

Manager Adam Clark said after the game "It was a pretty dominant performance, particularly in the first half. We could have scored a lot more goals, but I was delighted with the win and for Josh Drew to score a hat-trick on his first full debut".

# The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014–15 and 2015–16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013–14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3–2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2–2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015–16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4–2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IOW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3–1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016–17, again at The Camrose, and then 5–4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017–18 at Longmeadow after a 3–3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
