Hanworth Villa FC



Today's Visitors

We welcome Hanworth Villa to Barlow's Park today in the first ever encounter between the two sides. Today's visitors have had a steady start to the current league season with one win, two draws and no defeats. Looking at their more recent record, they didn't lose a single league game last season, so no doubt they will prove to be formidable opponents for us this afternoon.

The club was established in 1976 and initially played in the Hounslow & District League. They later transferred to the West Middlesex League before joining the Middlesex County League in 1984. In 2002-03 Hanworth were Premier Division champions also winning the Premier Division Cup with a 3-1 win against Stonewall. They were crowned champions again in 2004-05 earning promotion to Division One of the Combined Counties League. They finished as runners-up for the second time in 2008-09 gaining promotion to the Premier Division.

In 2011-12, Hanworth won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup and retained the trophy the following season. in 2013-14, they won the Southern Combination Challenge Cup for the second time, as well as winning the Combined Counties League Premier Challenge Cup by defeating Spelthorne Sports in the final. At the end of the 2015-16 season the club appointed former QPR and Fulham defender Rufus Brevett as manager having previously managed at Arlesey Town and coached at Banbury United. He successfully led the team to lift the Middlesex Senior Cup with a 3-2 win over Spelthorne Sports. Brevett then left the club by mutual consent in December 2018 to be succeeded by Louis Carder-Walcott.

After a poor run of form at the start of the 2019-20 season, Carder-Walcott stepped down to be replaced the current management and coaching staff. The team responded well to the new appointments along with the addition of several new players. Not only did they remain unbeaten in the 10 league matches in the curtailed season, but they also set a new club record by reaching the last 16 of the FA Vase before losing out to Long Eaton United on penalties.

Last season they were in 3rd position of the Combined Counties League Premier Division when the season was curtailed. Sam Merson was their top scorer with 14 league goals.

They play their home games at Rectory Meadow, Hanworth and are also affectionately known as 'The Villains' by their loyal band of supporters.



Crowded House



There have been some brilliant reported attendances this season so far. Crowds of over 400 at Ascot United, 250+ at Wokingham & Emmbrook on Tuesday night. 450 at Thatcham Town v Basingstoke Town over the weekend and of course, Bank Holiday Monday's amazing 671 at Binfield vs Bracknell Town.

According to the NonLeagueCrowd Twitter account, that 671 at Binfield was the eighth highest Step 4 crowd in the country - and this is without even looking at the crowds in the Vanarama National League where for example Slough Town have posted crowds of 500 and 600+ in both their home games so far.

So what's driving these numbers? Undoubtedly there will be an element of a post-Covid will to get out and about but avoid overly crowded spaces (and I recognise that Covid is very much still a thing), the ticket prices - which will likely be next weeks column - the ease of access, increased visibility thanks to a certain cup run last season (maybe?) and the complete sense of community around the whole game.

I also firmly believe that football locally is out there in front of people, through the media outlets that are covering it and clubs own websites and social media accounts really pushing all the right buttons.

A Neutral's View! by Gary Day

Tadley Calleva 1 Reading City 1 Combined Counties League - Premier Division (North) Monday 30th August 2021

Even though these clubs are located quite close they had never met competitively before. Both were in different leagues last season, Tadley in the Wessex and City in the Hellenic and they were moved to the Combined Counties due to the FA's latest re-organisation.

Tadley, who were still searching for their first 'Co-Co' point, enjoyed most of the first half. They had an early chance with Connor Thorne forcing City's keeper Andy Rider to make a low save. Rider was in ation again, tipping the ball over from beneath his own bar to prevent a Jordan Goater corner from going straight into the net. The visitors keeper continued to be the busier as he got down well to keep out a Carl Self effort who turned and hit it well.

Tadley took the lead when Aiden Harris laid a good pass that took Callum Cleary behind the City defence and Rider chased out and unceremoniously took out the Tadley player just inside the box. The home player required treatment and eventually Self stepped up to drive the spot-kick firm and low into the corner - that's how to take 'em!!

The home side continued to ask more questions and Sanchez Parkes sourced Self (looking suspiciously offside) who was in behind the City defence but his low shot went wide. City offered little in the half as Tadley deserved their interval advantage.

City added a tad more urgency to their play in the second half and they soon levelled. The ball was played into the home box, there was a possible handling offence by a defender, but it was knocked out to Josh Baines who buried a low 20-yard shot into the net. The assistant's flag was raised but it was deemed that a player in an offside position did not get a touch and the goal stood.

City threatened a fair bit and perhaps looked more likely to score the next goal, but the home defence stood firm and prevented any meaningful opportunities. Tadley substitute Ousman Darboe tried a shot from the edge of the area that went just over whilst an Andrew Charsley header from a set play was held high by Rider. Baines tried a 25-yard drive for City that just cleared the bar.. Late on, Parkes put Marcus Whittaker clear but he drove over for Tadley, whilst Suckling pulled the ball back for City and Cruz's shot had a similar outcome. FT: 1-1

It was a decent game and perhaps a fair result on the day. Tadley will rue not going in at the break having scored further goals when on top. But it's a point for the home team and something to build upon and enough to suggest the 'W' column will tick over very soon.

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed it's name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had it's best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (loW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved it's ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
