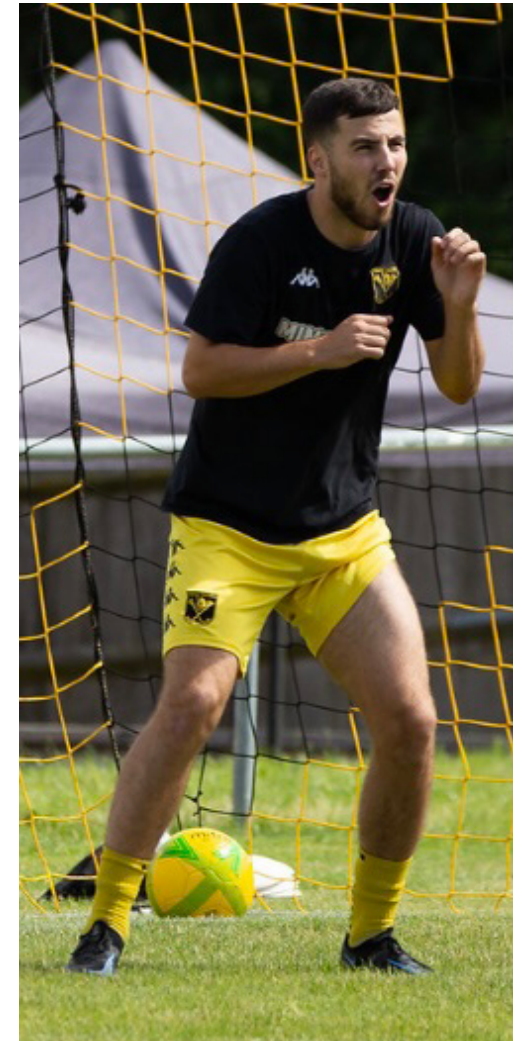

Burnham

Today's Visitors

We welcome Burnham to Barlow's Park today in the reverse fixture of this season's league campaign. We will be looking to put right a disappointing 5-4 loss at the 1878 Stadium back in November after looking comfortable leading 4-1 at the break. A hat-trick from Brett Denham and one from Jordan Goater should have seen us secure the points. But credit must be given to Burnham for their second half fightback and scoring the winner deep in injury time.

The club was founded in 1878, so Burnham FC is the second oldest club in Buckinghamshire. The team first joined a senior league in 1971 when they entered the Hellenic League Division 1A, finishing as runners-up in their first season, followed by finishing runners-up in Division 1 the following season which saw them promoted to the Premier Division. In 1975-76 they were crowned champions before switching to the Athenian League. They achieved two runners-up finishes and also reached the semi-final of the FA Vase.

They competed in the London Spartan League in 1984-85 winning both the Premier Division and League Cup. The summer of 1985 brought about the amalgamation of the club with Hillingdon Borough and they played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC. They reverted back to Burnham FC in 1987. The club finished bottom of the league in



season 1994-95 resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League. After three seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing 5th, 3rd and 3rd again in 1998-99, the club won the Premier Division and League Cup and gained promotion back to the Southern League.

Season 2012-13 was the most successful in the club's history when they won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship gaining promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League). The Reserves also won the Hellenic League Division 2 (East) championship in their first season gaining promotion to Division 1.

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Records Combined Counties League Premier Division (North). The re-named 1878 Stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme over the last 12 months providing the board with the chance to achieve one of their key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. In particular Burnham Juniors now enjoy the opportunity of both playing matches and training on the new football pitch together with other football clubs, including Chalvey Sports FC who play their 2021-22 home games at the stadium and Britwell FC who play on Friday nights.

Momentum is important in any team's season. What we wanted just prior to Christmas was more consistency and recent results are showing we are getting there. Our squad, just like everyone else's, has been hit with injuries and COVID cases, but great credit to the entire squad for the work they have put in at training over the past few months.

Today's opposition is a very good side and we know we will have to work very hard in order to claim all three points. Hopefully everyone gets behind the lads and you can enjoy the game!

Three is a Good Number...

Virginia Water 1 Tadley Calleva 3
Combined Counties League - Premier Division (North)
Saturday 22nd January 2022

This was our third win on the spin, all away from home, but I think it would be fair to say that we would not necessarily consider this as our best performance of the three, particularly in spells during the second half. However, a great win nevertheless and it proves that hard work and a determination not to concede can win you games when not at your best.

This was a crucial match for both sides. A single point separated the teams in the table prior to kick off. And, in the early stages, it was pretty obvious how crucial as most of the contest was fought out in the middle third with neither goalkeeper being tested. The home side were relying heavily on set piece moves, mainly from long throws and Tadley's only effort on goal was an Aaron Parfitt long range shot easily gathered in by home keeper Luke Wynn-Lintern. Virginia Water should have opened the scoring on 15 minutes after wide man Adam McNamara's clever square pass set up Turnell Sinclair, but the striker blasted wide of the target from 12 yards. This was to prove a pivotal miss as Tadley then opened the scoring on 22 minutes. An attempted headed clearance from an Aaron Parfitt corner was superbly driven home on the half volley from debutant Brody Peart at the edge of the box. We almost doubled our lead a minute later, but home keeper Wynn-Lintern was quick off his line to thwart Brett Denham by pushing his shot wide of the post. Virginia Water did create a half chance for an equaliser on the 36th minute, but Harry Brooks fiercely driven shot flew well wide of Craig Atkinson's far post.

Ben Wright then made it 2-0 just a few minutes later after being set up by the impressive Peart. Wright's well placed shot going in off the post. Peart then capped an excellent debut by making it 3-0 on the stroke of half time. A clever through ball by Parfitt found Denham on the right hand side of the box and his pinpoint cross was powerfully headed home by the youngster at the far post. (HT 0-3)

The home side started the second half in determined fashion and within a couple of minutes Turnell Sinclair crashed an effort off the bar when it looked easier to score. On 52 minutes Brett Denham thought he was about to score Tadley's fourth goal after a clever pass from Ben Wright, but an offside flag quickly stopped him in his tracks. Virginia Water got themselves back into the game shortly after. A strong headed clearance from Brad Neal was picked up some 30 yards out by midfielder Ross Nunn and, after taking a few strides, he drove a low shot wide of the despairing dive of Craig Atkinson. The goal fired the home side up and they eventually took control of the midfield for significant spells of the remainder of the second half. However, they were unable to create any further clear goal scoring opportunities as the found it difficult to break down a resolute Tadley defence. (FT 1-3)

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
