Tadley welcomed Hamworthy United for the first time to Barlow's Park in a confident mood after a fantastic midweek draw away at AFC Portchester. Steve Williams was again in charge as manager Danny Dolan served the second of his two match suspension.

There was one change from midweek with Brett Denham unable to recover from the injury he sustained at Portchester and Darryl Phillips came into the side.

Hamworthy were on a decent run of form themselves after winning five of their last six matches moving up to 6th place in the table, so we knew that this was going to be a very difficult game despite it being at home.

Similar to the Portchester match, Tadley started the better of the two sides. With only two minutes gone, Chad Abrams and Connor Thorne linked up well for Abrams to send his cross over for Sam Hamilton to head narrowly over the bar. Most of us in the ground definitely thought Sam had put us ahead!

However, it was Hamworthy who opened the scoring. Luke Stone found himself free at the far post from a free kick and his cut back was headed home by the unmarked Nathan Walker who had stayed up from the free kick. Tadley responded quickly and a strong Shaun Dallimore header was superbly saved by Hamworthy goalkeeper Tom Rees

Tadley didn't have to wait long to get back on level terms though. Sam Hamilton kept the ball alive in the Hamworthy box and his excellent cross picked out Danny Vickers to head home from six yards out.

The home crowd were getting frustrated as the visitors appeared to be getting away with a few robust challenges. Cann was fortunate to only receive a yellow for an elbow on Shaun Dallimore as he attempted to head the ball clear. And it was Cann who was then instrumental in Hamworthy taking the lead on the stroke of half time. His driven cross was deflected into the path of Stone who made no mistake at the far post.

Losing the goal on the stroke of half time had an obvious adverse effect on the side and we conceded a scrappy third goal ten minutes after the break. We were then punished further as Stone broke away to score his second of the match. We did give ourselves a slight glimmer of hope as George Hallahan played in Shemar Pettet to prod the ball past Rees with fifteen to go. However, although we pushed hard for the third it didn't come and Hamworthy seemed content to see the game out.

We travelled to Arlebury Park back in September in the first league meeting between the two sides this season and came away with a 2-1 win. Goals from Brett Denham and Daryll Phillips put us 2-0 up before a very late Rowan Vine goal made for a frantic final few minutes.

We also won 3-0 away back in April in the semi-final of the North Hants Senior Cup when Brett Denham scored two goals and Paul Coventry scored one. Paul moved to Alresford back in October and now lines up against us tonight.

According to local records football in Alresford dates back the 1980's, but the recent club was formed as recently as 1989 playing in the North Hants League. They moved into and through the Hampshire League before joining the Wessex League in 2004.

Relegation was narrowly avoided in their first season, but since then improvement has been steady and gradual. Tim Cole and Danny Robinson took over as joint Managers in 2010 - finishing 15th in their first season. They improved to the point where they then claimed runners-up spot in 2012-13. This capped a remarkable season in which the club also won the Wessex League Cup, the North Hants Senior Cup and

the Hampshire Senior Cup. The last named came as the result of a superb victory over AFC Bournemouth at Dean Court - having also defeated Aldershot FC on the way to the final.

As well as on field, there have been marked improvements off field in recent years with an extension to the changing room block, new floodlights and additional seating on the balcony - all making Alrebury Park a pleasant place for players, officials and spectators alike.

Alresford is a beautiful Georgian Town, once a wool town, but now the accepted capital of the UK watercress industry with the popular Watercress Festival held every year. It also boasts steam trains that run between Alresford and Alton on a regular basis and (because of the town's reputation) is known as the Watercress Line

Last season Alresford Town finished in 7th position in the Wessex League Premier Division and their top scorer was Tom Sands with 11 league goals.

The club play their home matches at Arlebury Park, Alresford, SO24 9EP. They are affectionately known as 'The Magpies' by their loyal band of supporters.

Other results from Saturday in the Premier Division saw leaders Sholing maintain top spot with a 4-2 win at Andover New Street. Horndean will feel that they dropped valuable points at Bemerton Heath Harlequins after letting a 3-1 lead slip to draw 3-3. Bournemouth drew 2-2 away at Bashley. Portland United were the only other top six side to win with a 2-1 win over AFC Portchester.

Our next opponents Brockenhurst gave themselves a confidence boost with a 2-1 home win over Hamble Club. Lymington Town also maintained some good form with an impressive 3-1 win over Baffins Milton Rovers. Team Solent moved further away from the relegation area with a 2-1 win over Cowes Sports. And finally, Christchurch and Shaftesbury shared the points with a 2-2 draw in their local derby.

We probably haven't had the 'rub of the green' in our last few matches which has meant that results haven't always matched our performances. However, I know that the Manager and the coaching staff have a strong belief in this squad of players to ensure we consolidate our position in this league as we enter the final stage of season.

A bit of bad news now. Unfortunately, our Reserve team skipper Charlie Cunningham suffered a triple leg break in the match against Alton on Saturday. We would like put on record our sincere thanks to the Alton staff for their on-field help and we would all wish Charlie a speedy and full recovery.

Tadley Calleva made the journey to face AFC Portchester last Tuesday evening after the original fixture was postponed at kick-off as a drastic change in the weather made the pitch unplayable.

With manager Danny Dolan suspended, Steve Williams took charge of the team for this match - ably supported by Glenn Taylor and George Coffin.

Tadley started well and almost took the lead inside the first few minutes. A 30-yard strike from Sam Hamilton grazed the top of the crossbar with Royals keeper Charlie Searle rooted. Danny Vickers had the next opportunity as his shot flew wide of the post as the visitors got off to a very positive start.

Tadley continued to dominate much of the first half and probably should have taken the lead on the half hour mark. Connor Thorne played a lovely through ball for Danny Vickers, but this time his chipped shot went over the bar as Searle came out to narrow the angle.

Connor Thorne was again involved in our next opportunity when his shot from distance crashed back off the bar and was subsequently cleared by the Portchester defence. As the teams went in level for the half time break, Tadley probably felt the most aggrieved of the two sides.

A quiet opening to the second half was eventually brought to life after Brett Denham set up Danny Vickers with another great opportunity. Vickers let fly with a tremendous shot which hit the Portchester post - the woodwork appeared the only barrier to Tadley taking the lead in this game.

The remainder of the second half ended up a pretty quiet affair as far as clear cut goal scoring opportunities were concerned. However, with ten minutes to go AFC Portchester were reduced to ten men after Craig Hardy was given his marching orders after receiving two yellow cards in quick succession. Unfortunately, Tadley were unable to capitalise on the extra man as Portchester held out for a share of the points.

Steve Williams felt that his side were very unlucky not to win the match after dominating for large spells. Manager Danny Dolan was unable to attend the game, but articulated his feelings through social media stating 'Brilliant point last night and a clean sheet. Thank you to Steve, Glenn and George and all my wonderful players'

The History

In brief

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd positions in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thattham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
