

Eight goals were shared in a keenly contested match at Test Park, with two goals in the final two minutes to earn the visitors a deserved share of the points.

Things started well for Tadley with their first chance of the game resulting in a goal. With four minutes on the clock a Brett Denham delivery from the left found the head of Danny Vickers who was able to see his header loop into the goal with Solent keeper Ollie Pike left rooted to the spot. Tadley almost doubled their lead just a couple of minutes later when a Shaun Dallimore header was somehow scrambled to safety off the line. With a quarter of an hour gone the Sparks' best chance broke down and the ball was quickly played up field with Denham feeding Connor Thorne, but his effort was off target as he didn't get a decent touch on the ball.

Team Solent had already made a penalty claim, but on 22 minutes Hisham Kasimu was impeded close to the edge of the penalty area and he picked himself up and fired home the equaliser from the spot. A somewhat bizarre own goal on 26 minutes eased the hosts to a 2-1 lead. A Ryan Penny cross was going nowhere, but the outstretched leg of Dallimore guided it beyond Freddie Gee to put Solent in front.

Things got worse for Tadley when just before the half hour mark it was 3-1. A Luke Mitchell through ball was latched on to by Silvano Obeng and it took him two attempts to get round the advancing Gee, but was able to convert from around eight yards out. With the break rapidly approaching a George Hallahan delivery was headed home by Brett Denham to make it 3-2.

After a last minute lapse by the hosts in the first half, they partially redeemed themselves by restoring a two goal cushion when Kasimu was up-ended right on the edge of the penalty area. Obeng took it this time and he fired it low to give him his 50th goal in under 100 starts. It looked like game over!

However the visitors didn't give in and forced Pike into making several good stops to keep the Sparks' in front. A Vickers shot on 65 minutes drawing a save with his legs - arguably his best. A couple of tactical changes saw the introduction of two subs for Tadley, with the second pushing Dallimore into an advanced position, and this worked wonders for the visitors as he headed the fourth goal in the final minute - barely two minutes after Brad Neal had volley home from 10 yards out to give Tadley a chance of a point.

Horndean come to Barlow's Park this afternoon sitting 2nd in the table and will be looking for the vital three points that would ensure that they would remain in the runners-up spot.

The reverse fixture was played in November at Five Heads Park with a 4-1 win for the home side. Goals by Harry Jackson, Benny Read and two for Zac Glasspool. Jake Nicholls with the reply for 10 man Tadley after Danny Vickers was sent off when the score was 2-1.

Last Saturday Horndean suffered a 3-1 loss away at Shaftesbury with Sean McMonagle on the score sheet and on Monday night they drew 2-2 with Team Solent at Test Park. Jack Lee scoring both Horndean goals.

The club was established in 1887 and played initially at Blendworth Hill before moving to their present ground. The played only friendly matches until joining Their home ground is Five Heads Park, Horndean, PO8 the Waterlooville & District League after the First World War - winning the league title on four occasions between 1926 and 1932.

The next step was the Portsmouth League and after gaining promotion to the Premier Division they took the league title three times in succession from 1969.

Progression continued to the Hampshire League where they moved from Division Four to Division One before becoming founder members of the Wessex League in 1986.

They suffered relegation back to the Hampshire League in 1995 but re-joined the Wessex League in 2004 before gaining promotion to the Premier Division in 2011.

Horndean have won the Portsmouth Senior Cup on four occasions and were defeated by Road Sea in the final of the inaugural Wessex League Cup.

Last season Horndean finished in 4th position out of 22 teams in the Premier Division - Harry Jackson their top scorer with an impressive 23 league goals.

Sydenhams Wessex League Premier Division Saturday 16th March 2019

After a cruel 3-1 loss at Hamworthy in mid-week, Tadley returned to Barlow's Park in search of their third home win in succession. Cowes Sports were the visitors, desperately needing the points to move them out of the second relegation spot.

The reverse fixture finished in a 1-1 draw earlier in the season in very windy conditions, and similar weather conditions were to play a part in this game.

Tadley started the brighter of the two teams with George Hallahan shooting from distance only to see his effort well saved by Ed Hatt in the Cowes goal. The visitors, with the wind at their backs, forced a corner on 10 minutes. The corner was subsequently cleared to Jack Broomfield who saw his shot go wide of the target.

Tadley's best chance to open the scoring fell to James
Tennant after he was played in by George Hallahan.
Unfortunately Tennant was off balance as he took the
shot and it flew wide of Hatt's goal. Hallahan was soon
involved again, but this time his shot from the edge of the
box smacked back off the post.

Tadley were dominant at this point and Brett Denham was next to test Hatt and the keeper stood up to the test as he managed to block Denham's effort. Hatt was playing his part in keeping the visitors on level terms and he was quick off his line to deny Connor Thorne.

We eventually got the break through our play deserved when a driven cross by Danny Vickers was met by Brett Denham as he slid in ahead of Broomfield. Unfortunately, our lead only lasted 5 minutes as on the 45th minute Cowes were awarded a free-kick 20 yards from our goal. Gareth Bricknell stepped up to slot the ball wide of Freddie Gee in the home goal.

Tadley started the second half in the same fashion as in the first and were soon bearing down on the Cowes goal. Hallahan found himself in good scoring positions only to see his efforts thwarted by the Cowes defence particularly Ed Hatt who was in superb form in goal. We eventually got, what proved to be, the winning goal after Danny Vickers drove forward from the half way line and let fly with an unstoppable shot which flew into the Cowes goal.

We continued to create several opportunities to extend our lead and Vickers struck the post, after being set up by Jake Nicholls, in the final minutes, but more importantly we secured the win that probably ensures we retain our Premier Division status for next season.

The History

In brief

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed it's name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd positions in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had it's best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (loW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved it's ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make signifiacnt progress with the infrastructure off the field.
