

Virginia Water FC



Today's Visitors

We welcome Virginia Water to Barlows Park today in the return league fixture from a few weeks back. We came away from Stag Meadow 3-1 victors in a very competitive match with Brody Peart (2) and Ben Wright on the score sheet for Tadley. Today will be an equally competitive affair with both sides looking to move further away from the foot of the table.

Virginia Water FC was formed during the 1919-20 season and during the 1930's, during the reign of King Edward VIII, gained financial support (patronage) from the crown to the sum of £2 per annum and this was continued after his abdication by King George VI and continued through his his reign. Waters were a part of the Woking & District league during this time until 1964 when they joined the Surrey Intermediate League, and then the Spartan League.

In 1969 the clubhouse at the Timbers was opened by Sir Stanley Rous CBE who was the then President of FIFA. The Timbers, on Crown Road, was named after the late Harry Timbers - one of the founder members of the club.

In the 1970's, Waters gained promotion to the Combined Counties League from the Spartan League. 1972 saw the club reach the 1st round of the FA Vase losing 3-1 to Egham Town. The 1980's were disappointing with relegation in successive seasons from the Combined Counties and Surrey Premier League's resulting in Waters dropping into the Surrey South Eastern Combination Intermediate League.

The 1991-92 season saw a change in fortunes with Virginia Water winning the Surrey Intermediate Cup beating Coney Hall 3-0 in the final. This was followed by successive promotions to eventually return to the Combined Counties League. However, they only stayed for one season due to a league ruling. Although returning to the Surrey Premier League, the club continued to be successful winning three Surrey County Premier Cups in 1995, 96 and 97 - the latter as part of a historic treble by adding the League title and League Cup to the trophy haul.

In 2002, Waters joined the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) playing in the Premier Division for 3 seasons before relegation in 2005. They gained immediate promotion the following season. They remained in the Surrey Intermediate League (Western) until 2010 winning promotion to the Surrey Elite League. Waters continued to progress and despite winning the league cup and County Cup on occasion, promotion proved elusive resulting in a number of managerial changes during that time.

The present manager Ceri Jones was appointed for the 2015-16 season and in his second full season in charge - and following the appointment of Richard Banks as First Team Coach - Waters completed an historic league and league cup double winning promotion to the Hellenic League. This season they will have an U18 side in the Allied Counties League creating a direct pathway from U16 to adult football.

Battling Performance...

Hanworth Villa 2 Tadley Calleva 0
Combined Counties League - Premier Division (North)
Saturday 5th February 2022

Unbeaten Hanworth Villa certainly found themselves in a competitive match against a re-shaped Tadley side. With Shaun Dallimore and Jordan Goater both still injured, Scott Kinge not available and Aaron Parfitt not fully fit, joint Managers Ben Dillon and Joe Lawler opted for a three man defence. The game was barely minutes old when the 'Villains' lost the league's leading scorer, Sam Merson, to injury.

However, this did not stop the home side going ahead on 12 minutes with the lively Meshach Williams covering after a right wing break by Jordan Ellis. The three man defence of Andrew Charsley, skipper Brad Neal and Kieran Maylen were solid with keeper Craig Atkinson also in good form. Despite this Hanworth did have a couple of opportunities to add to the scoreline. Aiden Harris, as a right wing back, was prominent going forward, often prompted by Ousman Darboe and Callum Cleary. On the other wing Lloyd Snell was getting less service. Having forced a number of corners, Tadley were unfortunate to be denied a very strong penalty claim for deliberate handball. In spite of some guilty home looks, the referee confirmed after the match that he was unsighted.

In the second half Tadley were the more dominant team although, prompted by the clever Ben Merson, the Villains remained dangerous. On 55 minutes, Brad Neal's powerful header from a Darboe corner was grasped safely by veteran home keeper Terry Buss. The keeper on several occasions, quickly came off his line to cancel out

clever ball promptings from Ben Wright - operating in a deeper position. Lloyd Snell was now more prominent and causing problems by running at the home back line. Tadley sought to add to the tackling pressure through substitutions: Lucas Burt replacing Brett Denham on 60 minutes and Kalum Cousins replacing Max Elward on 68 minutes. On 65 minutes, a good move involving Cleary and Snell saw the ball in the net only to be ruled out by the Assistant's flag. In the 88th minute, released by Ben Wright, Cousins saw his firm angled drive from 20 yards fly inches past the far post with the keeper beaten.

And still Tadley pressed. Having looked dangerous from a succession of corners, our boys pushed all but one player forward into the box in added time in a gamble for a deserved equaliser. Sadly, this allowed Hanworth to break clear with centre back Bruno Tingle running 60 yards with the ball - three against one - releasing Merson who squared for Shadrach Malembe to score. Whilst disappointed to see the deficit double, the gamble was worth it and our management team and players can be proud of the performance.

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995-96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed its name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007-08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.

Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010-11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4-1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had its best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (IoW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved its ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make significant progress with the infrastructure off the field.
