Please see below the match day arrangements;

- > Gates will be open from 6.45pm
- > Crowd capacity of 300 spectators.
- > Entry Fee: ADULTS £6.00, CONCESSIONS £3.00 (On a first come basis until the limit is reached)
- > Track and Trace details must be provided on entry to the clubhouse and stadium.
- > Players, Coaches and Match Officials are the ONLY persons permitted to enter the changing room area.
- > Spectators must adhere to Government Guidelines regarding social distancing, (maximum groups of six).
- > Spectators must also adhere to social distance markings and all signage on display.
- > Spectators must comply with our temporary 'one way' system for entry & exit from the clubhouse and stadium.
- > There is adequate car parking. Please respect the bays marked for disabled spectators and also the the entrance ramp to the emergency access gates.
- > Male, Female and Disabled toilet facilities are accessed at the front of the main building.

Today's Visitors

The club was founded in 1919 as the Royal Engineers (Ordnance Survey Office) FC by soldiers returning from the First World War. However there is a record of matches being played by the Ordnance Survey Royal Engineers against The Gentlemen of Tenby.

The club joined the Southampton Junior League in 1919. They won the Junior B Cup in 1920-21 and were admitted to the Hampshire League Divisional Sections - which was the Junior League with no automatic right to promotion. They were runners-up to Cowes in their first season but no promotion.

The Divisional Section was split into East & West Sections the following year and the club finished in mid-table in the East Division. Around that time the club began a long association with the Civil Service Ground. Nicknamed 'The Mapmakers' it's believed that they merged with the Post Office team when they moved to the Civil Service Ground they formed a new club, Southampton Civil Service in 1923-24 and finished fourth in the West Division.

Jumping forward a number of years the club had progressed to the Hampshire League Division One and now the club had realised that a stable future lay in the hands of young players so set up a youth policy.

This proved a great success as the U18 side won Southamption Youth Division 3 at the first attempt. The 1st Division of the Hampshire League proved to be too strong and the club were relegated in their frst season at the higher level in 1999-00. Positions of 11th, 8th, 4th & 6th were attained before the formation of the Sydenhams Football League 3rd Division in 2004-05. The team finished 13th & 12th in that league before opening a new chapter in the club's history by changing it's name to Stoneham in 2006.

After finishing 14th in the Sydenhams Football League in 2006-07 the club long with 16 other teams became founder members of the newly formed Hampshire Premier League which was set up after the dissolution of the botton division. During the 2007 close season the club added 'AFC' to Stoneham which had an immediate effect with AFC Stoneham winning the Hampshire Premier League in 2007-08 and reachning the final of the League Cup - just missing out on an impressive double. In 2015 the club earned promotion to the Sydenhams Football League after winning the Hampshire Premier League for the second time.

Last season they were in 2nd spot in the league when the season ended. Scott Hills was their top scorer with an impressive 20 league goals from 23 starts.

A little bit too close!

Tadley Calleva 2 Hamble Club 1 Sydenhams Wessex League Premier Division Saturday 5th September 2020

After the high of Tuesday night and getting into the next round of the FA Cup, we were looking forward to our opening day Wessex League fixture against Hamble Club. This fixture was reversed at the request of the Southampton based club due to drainage issues with their home pitch.

Manager Adam Clark had several injury problems to deal with after Tuesday's encounter and was forced to go into the match without Shay Barham, Josh Drew and Tom Walsh respectively. However, Brad Neal was able to make his return to the starting line up.

The first half was a pretty even affair with neither side playing particularly well. Hamble's style was pretty direct with keeper Ellis Grant's distribution the visiting sides main threat. Adam Bartlett had a great opportunity to open the scoring for Tadley on 30 minutes, but he saw his first time effort fly wide. A few minutes later a great shot by George Farrelly hit the top of the crossbar with keeper Grant rooted to the spot.

Fawley looked to have broken the dealock on 40 minutes, but a brilliant diving save by Jack Martin denied Sam Tonks with Brad Neal able to complete the clearance. Just as it looked as though we would go in at the break on level terms Tadley were awarded a penalty. Slack play by Hamble's Ethan Madden allowed Adam Bartlett to break free and the pull back earned Madden a red card. Jordan Goater made no mistake from the spot for 1-0

We got off to the perfect start to the second half as Brad Neal doubled our advantage with a flying header from a Jamie Johnston corner. We were now dominating the game with Hamble beginning to look a bit weary. We were unlucky not to add to the scoring and put the game beyond Hamble, but Jordan Goater's driven shot hit the base of the post with Lors Nicholas unlucky not to make better contact with the rebound.

Then with twenty minutes remaining Hamble got a lifeline after we had switched off from a corner kick. Ryan Wilkins was on hand to head home a Jones cross. The goal definitely unsettled us and gave the visitors the lift they needed. They pushed everything at us in the final 15 minutes and only some excellent goalkeeping from Jack Martin prevented Hamble leaving with a point. The only downside was seeing Jordan Goater sent off in injury time for alleged retaliation.

Manager Adam Clark said after the game "It was great to get off to a winning start in the league. We dominated large periods of the game but didn't take our opportunities which made for a nervous end to the game".

The History

Tadley has had a football team since the early 1900's. In the modern era the team was re-formed in 1989 and played in the Basingstoke and North Hants Leagues before winning promotion to the Hampshire League. The club was formed as Tadley F.C. in 1989. They joined the Hampshire League Division Three in 1994, finishing runners-up in 1995–96, gaining promotion to Division Two.

The club changed it's name to Tadley Town F.C. in 1999 and joined Division One upon re-organisation. In 2004, they changed their name to their present name and entered the Wessex Football League Division Three.

Division Three was re-named Division Two in 2006, and the club finished runners-up in 2007. In the 2007–08 season, they won the Wessex League Division One title but were denied promotion as their ground did not meet the requirements for the Premier Division. The Reserve side was also very successful in the same season by taking the Wessex Combination League title.


Since then the team has remained in Division One and has steadily been making progress on and off the field year on year. They narrowly missed out on promotion in 2014-15 and 2015-16 respectively by finishing in 3rd position in both seasons.

In the 2010–11 campaign they reached the final of the Basingstoke Senior Cup losing to Thatcham Town 4–1. The club then went on to win the same cup in 2013-14 beating local rivals AFC Aldermaston 3-2 (aet) in the final. In September 2014, the club recorded probably the best result of its modern history, defeating Conference South Basingstoke Town on penalties in the Hampshire FA Senior Cup at The Camrose after a 2-2 draw in 90 minutes.

The club had it's best run in the FA Vase in season 2015-16 reaching the 3rd round proper before eventually being knocked out 4-2 after a replay and extra-time against Newport (loW) from the Wessex Premier Division.

They have also reached the final of the North Hants Senior Cup in the last two seasons; losing out 3-1 to local rivals Whitchurch United in 2016-17, again at The Camrose, and then 5-4 on penalties to Andover New Street in 2017-18 at Longmeadow after a 3-3 draw in normal time.

The club achieved it's ambition of gaining promotion to the Wessex League Premier Division last season - the highest level (Step 5) that the club has competed at. The goal is to consolidate its position on the field and to make signifiacnt progress with the infrastructure off the field.
